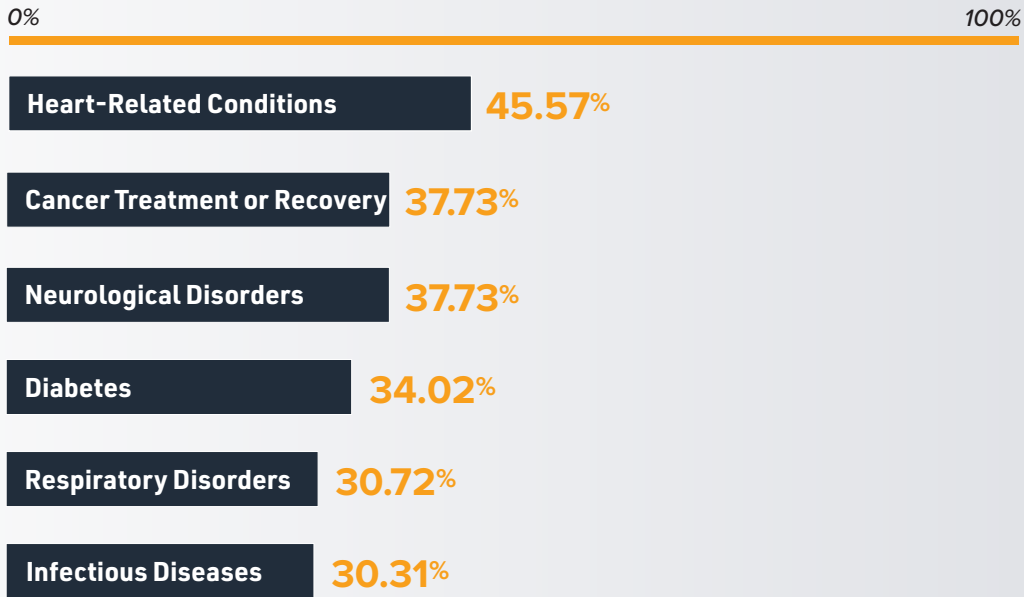

## Top 3 Reasons patients are willing to participate in at-home monitoring

- 46% Convenience and Comfort of Home
- 23% Avoiding Infection Exposures in Hospital
- 18% Confidence in Remote Patient Monitoring

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
